1. Introduction

This technical consultation meeting was held in Nairobi Kenya from 4-7 September 2006. The meeting was hosted and chaired by the Nairobi Organising Committee for the WSF 2007. It included delegates from the various WSF councils and forums, from Kenya, Tanzania, Somalia, Ethiopia, Zimbabwe, Italy, Spain and Brazil. The meeting was officially opened by Prof. Edward Oyugi (Nairobi Organising Committee).

The first part of the day was used to clarify all the concepts (space, perspectives, and terrains) used and to agree on the agenda for the meeting¹. The agenda for the Nairobi meeting and the list of participants is included in annex 1 and 2.

2. Objectives for the thematic terrains

After reviewing the consultation results, the Brazilian delegation proposed nine (9) objectives that would be instrumentally in organising the thematic terrains. It should be noted that these objectives are only for the purpose of organizing the “thematic terrains” as this will be informed by the physical space available at the venue.

Each objective was discussed through plenary and agreed as follows:

1. building a world of peace, justice, ethics and respect for diverse spiritualities;
2. liberating the world from the domination of multinational and financial capital;
3. ensuring universal and sustainable access to the common goods of humanity and nature;
4. democratization of knowledge and information;
5. ensuring dignity, defending diversity, guaranteeing gender equality and eliminating all forms of discrimination;
6. guaranteeing the right to food, healthcare, education and decent work;
7. building a world order based on sovereignty, self-determination and rights of peoples;
8. constructing a people-centred and sustainable economy;
9. Building real democratic political structures and institutions with full people’s participation on decisions and control of public affairs and resources.

¹ It was agreed on the Rome meeting that on September 3rd, the IC would look at the results of the consultation process. On 4 and 5 September, there would be a meeting of the Methodology and Content commission. And On 6 to 8 September, the technical meeting proper would take place (logistics).

3. Discussion on Program and Methodology

Candido G. and Chico W. provided an overview of the issues discussed during the Rome meeting and that were to be addressed by this meeting in Nairobi:

It was agreed in Rome that the forum in Nairobi should move toward the agglutination not only of topics but also of the capacity to manage the initiatives. The rationale is to ensure that the forum ultimately results in new defined new actions plans, and to be able to synthesize these into to campaigns; taking into account the diverse nature always and plurality of perspective as stated in the chapter of principles.

The WSF has learned, through the years that self organized activities is the way to respect the diversity among all organizations.

However, the WSF in Nairobi will try to agglutinate and merge activities; in an active manner respecting that the various mandates of the participating organizations themselves. This is a believed that this methodological will be further transformed for the WSF 2007.

In addition, the co-organized activities are fundamental for the WSF process. This will include emphasis or highlighting of African issues, struggles and solutions, within a global perspective on problems, struggles and solutions. This does not mean that other issues will not be given the same importance viz a viz other issues of global importance.

4. WSF 2007 Programme

As was discussed and agreed in Rome, the WSF 2007 programme will be as follows: the first three days will be dedicated to self-organized activities and co-organized activities and one day only (the forth day) for sharing and planning on what it was done during these three first days and for the future. This is outside of the two days dedicated to the opening and closing ceremony.

It has been proposed that the three working days will be divided into four sessions. The first three sessions will be for self organized activities and the last one will be for the proposed activities emerging from the African Social Forum and the organising committee (OC). In this way, the co-organized activities will not compete for space and audiences with the self-organized activities and people will have an opportunity to attend them.

On the forth day, the idea is to work inside the terrains but sharing with different people involved on that, what they have done, discussions, proposals, and so on. In the morning of the forth day, people will discuss how to link, but still don't have a methodology for how to do it. Naturally, not an assembly where each one has 10 minutes to speak about what they jus did, this will never be good. So, here is an idea, to have an "exhibition space" of "expressions" all types of expressions. For example any organization that develops an activity during these first three days, and don't know how it went. That organization must put in common with other people to see what they did. That organization can use theater can use music, anything; it is then a space that everyone tells what they did in the way they want. Everybody is circulating this space, which makes it very confuse but very interesting.

In the afternoon, then, that is the question. How are we going to sit people to plan? That is the challenge. Are we are going to say to people please plan; please

systematize what you want to do. Are we going to send people to their small places or people stay at bigger places? That is the question. The second period of the fourth day is a lot more difficult, but then the agglutination process can be transformed in a direction process. We can respect, then, the diversity of choices and options of everybody without imposing anything but doing so that that thing can be visible. The idea is to be visible.

Also there is a proposal here about initiating a process of systematization and memory. The idea is to have a group working on memory, to help the WSF to capture the main thinking, which will give a sense of belonging not only for one activity but for the whole process of the forum.

After this presentation, a deep discussion took place and 5 important points were identified that need to be addressed by the meeting: (1) facilitation, (2) co-organized activities, (3) memory and systematization, (4) the organization of the fourth day, and (5) opening and closing sessions.

5. Venues for the WSF 2007

It was discussed that the Uhuru Park would not be a feasible venue for the WSF 2007 because the OC have not been able to reach an agreement with the local government for the preparation that needed to be done. Then, the Nyayo Stadium was suggested but also presented problems of physical space available for the needs of the forum.

Therefore, it was suggested that the "Moi International Sports Centre" (Kasarani sports centre) would be negotiated as the venue for all the WSF 2007 activities. A visit to the site was organized, during the afternoon of Tuesday Sept. 5th, for the participants to the new venue and it was unanimously agreed that the new site would satisfy all requirements for the WSF.

6. Reports from the Working Groups

What follows is a brief presentation of the results of each working group that were established to address specific issues that arose during the discussions. See the full report please refer to the annexes:

6.1 Logistic, Resources and Culture Report

(a) Brief History on the resource mobilization

- The role of the international committee has been to provide guidance to the organizing committee on the possible funding sources and approaches. It has also shared strategies of resource mobilization that have been used in the previous World Social Forums

- Three people i.e. Teo, Nandita and Rolando Lopez were assigned the task of guiding the resource mobilizing for World Social Forum 2007 (need more input/clarity from Odour). They will produce a report by the end of the year
- Experiences from various institutions, which have organized and hosted previous Social Forums, show that there are several challenges in resource mobilization and these vary widely. For instance during the World Social Forum hosted by IBASE in the institution incurred a deficit of approximately US\$ 1 million which has not been cleared to-date. While the WSF of 2004 in Mumbai there was a substantial surplus by the organizers.

(b) Current situation on the Resource Mobilization for WSF 2007

Given that the WSF 2007 will be held in Kenya, it is necessary to share the responsibilities as well as resources between the African Social Forum (ASF) and Kenya Social Forum to carry out the various activities towards a holding the forum.

A memorandum of Understanding (MOU) was developed between ASF and KSF detailing the roles and responsibilities of the two parties. In brief ASF is responsible among other things for mobilization at the continental level while KSF is responsible for coordinating mobilization within the five Eastern Africa countries (Ethiopia, Kenya, Tanzania, Somalia and Uganda).

A budget was finalized in June 2006 at EUR 4.9 million (Approx KES 452 million) of which EUR 3.9 million (approx KES 364 million) would be used by KSF and EUR 0.95 million (approx KES 87 million) would be used by ASF.

The following table illustrates the current pledged resources and what has been received as of end August 2006:

It should be noted that the budget in October to reflect the current reality with regard the resource mobilisation exercise.

(c) Action Points

- Budget will be revisited in mid October to take into consideration actual funds realized and revise expenditures according to realities (taking into consideration progress on the commitments and changes leading to reductions in costs e.g. change of venue)
- Registration fees - country social forums will be charged with the responsibility of registration and collection of fees from participants who are not in position to utilise the online registration facility. The details of this modality will be developed further by KSF and national social forums informed on the details and requirement procedures.
- There is need for continuation of aggressive fundraising with the support of the International Committee.

6.2. Mobilisation, Youth and Media and Publicity

The group presented a frame work to address the communication and media taking into account documents from previous and ongoing WSF processes, which have to be integrated along with the current activities taking place at the international, continental and national level. It should be noted that most of the WSF processes in this regard are decentralised.

The general objective is to translate the spirit and sense of the WSF to the general public through the media. The group also drafted three specific objectives. The first one is to include, or reach, the media in the WSF process. The second is to support the local social forums in their relationship with media and to support their current mobilisation activities. Under this objective we should note that there will be a need to document testimonies from local people working at the community level, these testimonies will be included in the Bulletin. And the third is to ensure that all information collected will be added the documentation of all information garnered through the WSF 2007 (including pre- and post event).

Current Activities:

(a) Africa Social Forum

At the African level a strategy has already been adopted by the ASF since March 2006. There are some specifics that should be revisited and be integrated in the implementation of the strategy for the WSF. So far 70% of the planned activities have already been implemented. This approved document will be shared with Secretariat of WSF2007 and the Media Information and Communication (MIC) Working Group.

This new Media Strategy includes the concept of the "Radio African Flame" (networking strategy through different radio station across Africa); different media training sessions at regional and national levels and drawing from the experience from Bamako. In addition there will be initiatives to attract international media e.g. (Al-Jazeera, French Channel 5) and to mobilize the entire national media community (which is already taking place).

(b) Tanzania Social Forum

The Tanzanian Social Forum has also developed a media strategy. Different initiatives are taking place (i.e. Pambazuka Newsletter). Tanzania based TV stations such as Star TV and Channel 10 indicated that they will cover the WSF 2007 event). It should be noted that for this meeting a Tanzanian journalist was present and reported on the progress of the meeting through the Tanzanian media (in Kiswahili and English).

(c) WSF 2007 Organising Committee

Media

With regard the Nairobi Organizing Committee, two Media Strategy papers have been developed (Nicholas Otieno from CARITAS/AACC and African Woman and Child Feature Services). In addition the media and publicity action plan has been revised; different articles have been published by national and regional newspapers. There is a dedicated 30 min. program for a special program on the WSF, every Saturday, called WAUMINI on one of the local radio stations.

A finalised Strategy and Plan will be presented to the Secretariat of WSF 2007 and then shared with the African Social Forum Council and the MIC Working Group. Nicholas Otieno mentioned that CARITAS/AACC has resources available for national and regional Training for Media. This will be in November 2007.

One recommendation is to include traditional means of communication as part of the media strategy (e.g. drums). In addition, a logo or brand for WSF 2007, has to be developed and should be rooted in the culture and that has meaning of the social movement. Some of the proposals are as follows:

- Baobab tree, based on the ancient wisdom, the respect and the efficiency that it evokes.
- Other trees could symbolize other regions of the world. It was suggested that, as part of the Editorial Guidelines, a BRAND IDENTITY for the WSF Nairobi 2007 could be developed from the approved symbol.

Further to this discussion was the ways in which the OC would interact with the media to ensure that the right messages were being portrayed through editorial pieces in the local media. It was noted by Prof. Oyugi that media (at least here in Kenya) was not neutral and had to be managed carefully. The Media Strategy has to stress the meaning of the struggles in the minds of the people that the WSF 2007 is targeting.

MEDIA – MEANS. A constant analysis of the media coverage is needed in order to establish a counter strategy, focusing on the real struggles. In order to reach the mainstream media, it is important to directly meet with the press houses and the international media centres.

Website

The web page is now online, and has information in different languages. The address is www.wsf2007.org

6.3. Content and Methodology:

This working group has prepared a time table for the registration and program. Four people will review the registration forms (Jose, Candido, Fatma and Moema) for activities, organizations and individual. The registration process will start on Sept. 26th, and will be closed on Nov. 15th 2006.

During the registration process, weekly monitoring reports will be sent to the content and methodology commission in order to prepare for the next meeting, which will take place around the 20th and the 25th of Nov., and will prepare the final program for the WSF 2007.

The Organizing Committee will prepare a proposal for the topics of the co-organized activities (theses could be cultural activities, testimonies, conferences, round table, tables of controversies, etc.), which would have as a reference the 9 objectives agreed upon. One first draft document will be circulated at the end of Sept. to be discussed during the next meeting of the International Council in Parma, Italia. Oct. 10-12 2006.

For the forth day, a concept paper that includes all aspects of the methodology will be drafted and sent to the Organizing Committee in Nairobi before Sept. 26th 2006, and comments will be circulated by e-mail before the next meeting of the international Council.

7. Summary of Relevant Agreements and Points to Follow up

1. The plenary discussed and agreed on each of the 9 thematic objectives. See page 3 of this report.
2. It was agreed that the new venue for the WSF 2007 will be the Kasarani International Sport Centre.
3. Different documents from the SF on Media and Publicity that refers to strategy have to be integrated as well as the current activities that are taking place at the international, continental and national level.
4. Every National-Regional Social Forum will send information to up date the web page especially on news and events in the road to 2007.
5. Budget will be revisited in mid October to take into consideration actual funds realized and revise expenditures according to realities (taking into

consideration progress on the commitments and changes leading to reductions in costs e.g. change of venue)

6. In relation to collection of registration fees country social forums will be charged with the responsibility of registration and collection of fees from participants who are not in position to utilize the online registration facility. The details of this modality will be developed further by KSF and national social forums informed on the details and requirement procedures.
7. There is need for continuation of aggressive fundraising with the support of the International Committee.
8. Media strategies to be finalised and circulated to relevant persons for comments.

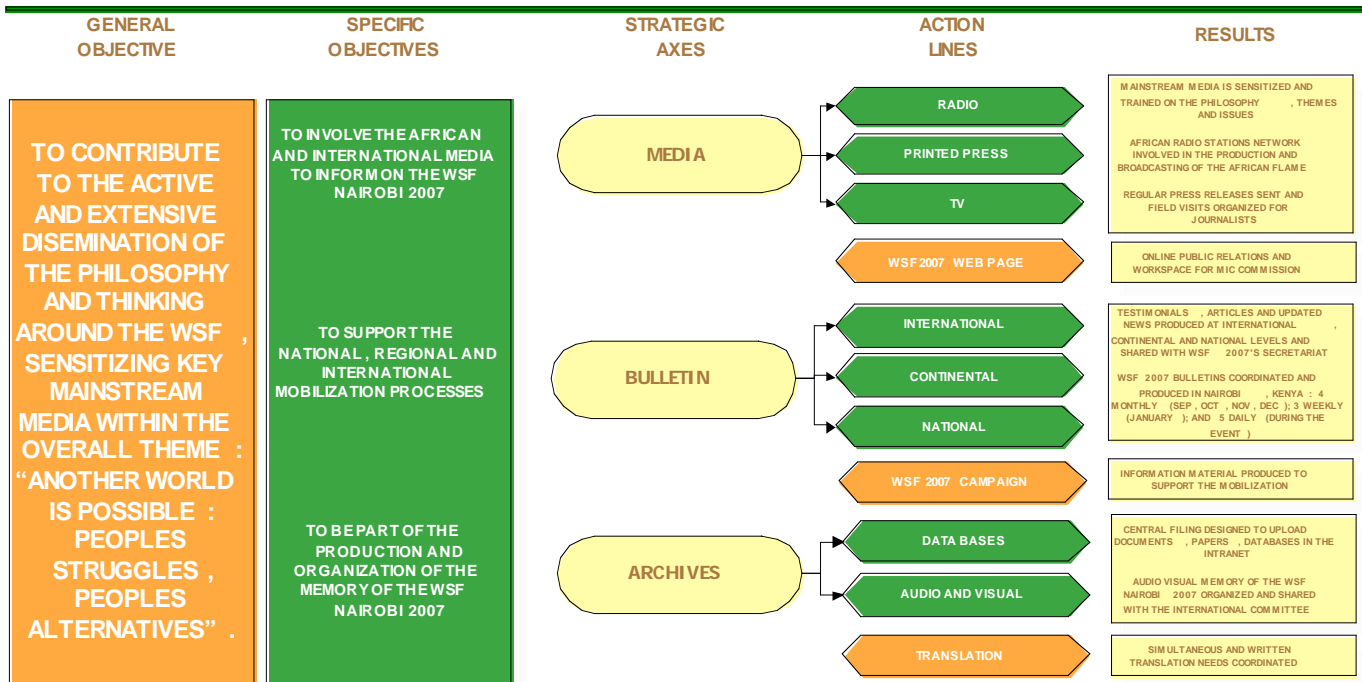
